He basically told me that his preliminary conclusion upon their review was that this matter is being handled in at least one judicial forum if not two and that he did not see a reason why they should intervene. However, they would review the materials. I expressed my disappointment and view of the importance of them investigating this matter. I asked him if he needed anything else from us, and he said no.

I believe that we should send him a carefully worded email expressing disappointment in their declination of our meeting and explaining in a few bullet points why this matter is of the utmost importance for their office to engage in a comprehensive review and for the perpetrators to be held accountable. Dear Chris:

As you know from our telephone calls and my prior communications with Susan, I was looking forward to meeting with you and/or Susan regarding potential crimes committed within New York County by members of law enforcement in connection with a matter prosecuted by the United States Attorney's Office for the Eastern District of New York. Specifically, in connection with the prosecution of Keith Raniere (*United States v. Raniere, et al.*,18 Cr. 204 (NGG)), significant and crucial pieces of electronic evidence appear to have been accessed and tampered with while in the custody of Federal Bureau of Investigation agents and in particular, the Bureau's Computer Analysis Response Team. I accept but was disappointed that your office chose to cancel our meeting. The handling, mishandling, use, and alleged tampering of this evidence is deserving of investigation by an impartial and globally respected office like DANY that can reach its own evidence-based conclusions.

The evidence in question has been reviewed by a former FBI forensics expert, Dr. Richard Kiper. Dr. Kiper, after an extensive forensic analysis, reached the conclusion that the only explanation for the numerous anomalies in the evidence was that, while in the custody of the FBI, the evidence was tampered with. His analysis and conclusions, considered together with serious improprieties and violations of FBI protocol regarding the handling of electronic evidence as well as the arguably perjurious testimony of an agent at trial regarding the reliability of the evidence, implicates the New York Penal Law within New York County. Mr. Kiper's analysis and conclusions have been echoed by two other experts who have also analyzed the evidence. Furthermore, at least three other recognized forensic experts are in the process of analyzing the evidence and thus far are reaching the same conclusions.

The implications of the FBI's handling and potential tampering with this evidence in the prosecution of Mr. Raniere are obviously significant and are the subject of motion practice in that criminal case under the standards that apply in post-conviction litigation. But the implications and importance of the facts relating to the handling and potential tampering of evidence by the FBI transcends Mr. Raniere's case. I do not represent Mr. Raniere and I have never even spoken with him. Likewise, Dr. Kiper is a third-party expert brought in by defense counsel and has never spoken to Mr. Raniere. The conclusions reached by Dr. Kiper and others are driven by a comprehensive analysis of the evidence. The conclusions he has reached trouble him, as a former supervisory employee and trainer of trainers for the FBI, more than anyone else. There is credible forensic evidence, certified to a scientific certainty by three computer forensics experts, that criminal tampering occurred. The experts in this case have a combined experience of 100 years, and none have ever seen anything like it.

>From our conversation, I understand that someone within DANY was pulling all publicly available information and reviewing the allegations. We encourage you to do so and please know that Dr. Kiper is available should you have any questions. I have attached documents to this email for your review that we believe would be helpful in any analysis of the issue to the extent that you have not already obtained and/or reviewed them.




